South Africa is Africa's largest economy and usually is the prime mover for OECD activities supporting the objectives of NEPAD, especially in Southern Africa, on taxation, investment, competition policy and governance. As the OECD and South Africa deepen their collaboration, South African policy makers gain access to OECD expertise and good policy practices; the OECD, in turn, benefits.

South Africa also performs below the OECD average in terms of water quality, as 67% of people say they are satisfied with the quality of their water, below the OECD average of 81%. Concerning the public sphere, there is a strong sense of community, where 88% of people believe that they know someone they could rely on in time of need, broadly in line with the OECD average of 89%.
